The gentlemen residing at the Sandusky home have a new gazebo to enjoy this summer.

The 12 x 24 Victorian-style gazebo is fully-screened with a 36-inch door for accessibility. It is constructed with composite flooring, white vinyl trim and a metal roof for low maintenance and long-term durability.

The gazebo will accommodate all the residents, plus their support staff. There are no benches inside enabling those in wheelchairs to get close to look out. Ambulatory residents will use lawn chairs.

The gentlemen at Sandusky contributed half the cost of the gazebo. **Jeff Sipes,** guardian of two of the gentlemen in the home and a long-time Pathway supporter, made a significant contribution to cover the remaining cost.
